Sub: Approval to commence Roll out of ICJS project at state level.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved the proposal of the Ministry of Home Affairs for a major revamp of the Crime and Criminals Tracking Network and Systems (CCTNS) Project on 18th November 2015. The project included the implementation of Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS), which integrates CCTNS with e-Courts, e-Prisons, Forensics and Prosecution- the key components of the criminal Justice System.

2. The scope of the project includes providing search and visual analytics over various data-sets, preparing user interactive dashboards for stakeholders to facilitate to identify Key Performance Indicators (KPI) using Business Intelligence (BI) tools and capability to achieve one data once entry across all the pillars. The project aims towards Smart Policing, which include empowering Citizen, Investigating Agencies and Policy Makers. Briefly the project aims towards:

- a) Carry out National search across all the pillar of Justice (Police, Prison, Court, Prosecution, CBI, NIA, NCB, FSL etc.) on a single platform.
- b) Analyze the National dashboard for various purposes.
- c) Minimize data entry through the concept of "one data once entry" across all the pillars.

3. The ICJS team already created a platform to share crime & criminal information among various pillars of Indian Judicial system i.e. Police, Court, Prison, FSL, WCD, NIA, NCB, CBI etc. to ensure quick data transfer, fast track investigation, enhanced transparency and improved citizen-centric services. Presently, the ICJS team is succeeded in achieving the following:

- a) Aggregation of the required data of CCTNS in ICJS from NDC system. However, there are data gaps due to limitation of Wipro system design to make regular updation.
- b) The e-Forensic system is developed and implemented in 10 locations and roll out of the same is in progress.

- c) The e-Prosecution system is developed and already integrated with e-court. System can be rolled out once the required PCs with connectivity are made at state level.
- d) The e-Prison and e-court systems are already integrated with ICJS for Karnataka and Delhi.
- e) National Search and Dashboard for CCTNS is already released but its use is very limited as only one user in each state is released.

4. The best way to encourage the state to enter the complete data in CCTNS is to facilitate the operational staff to use the feature of "one data once entry". That is, if a field (data) is entered in one pillar (say police), which would be made possible to consume in other pillars (like prosecution, forensic, court, prison, etc.). To achieve "one data once entry" the following are the crucial activities:

- Direct access to SDC by ICJS to exchange web services.
- The state SI should provide web services to exchange data with ICJS.

5. During the previous meetings, it was proposed to commence these projects in the following pilot states due to the reasons given in the bracket:

- **Bihar** (As all the software including CCTNS belongs to NIC, web services can be achieved easily).
- **Delhi** (Easily accessible by central ICJS team).
- **Rajasthan** (CCTNS is hoisted in cloud and Wipro agreed to provide the web services).
- **Karnataka** (The state SI already provided web services to their e-court which can be easily extended to achieve the Goal).
- **Telangana** (The Nodal officer of Telangana assured to arrange the web services with ICJS).

6. Presently, the state administration of Bihar is busy in handling flood affected areas, it may take more time to concentrate on the project, the state of Delhi, Rajasthan and Telangana yet to develop the web services. The state of Karnataka is already developed the web services and keen to implement the ICJS asap. On 11th of September, Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department, Govt. of Karnataka had taken a meeting, in which NIC-state Informatics officers, CCTNS/ICJS Nodal officer & NIC-IVFRT/ICJS state coordinator are also present. The state Informatics officer conveyed

the undersigned to visit on 3rd October along with ICJS-team to explain all the stake holders (Police, Prison, Court, Prosecution & Forensic) about the modality of implementation & the role of each stake holders for successful implementation of the ICJS.

7. In view of the above, the following may please be approved:

(p/c-60.1)

I. The draft letter along with enclosure to state/UT CCTNS/ICJS nodal officers to communicate their readiness with web services from CCTNS to ICJS and MHA would facilitate the implementation in the states on "first come first serve" basis depending on their readiness.

II. The visit of undersigned along with one officer from NCRB for two days (3rd and 4th of October). NIC has already agreed to depute their team in Bengaluru for this purpose during the same period.

Sub: Initiation for implementation of 2nd Phase of ICJS project.

The ICJS project was initiated by MHA in November 2015 and the responsibility of execution of the project was assigned to NIC through **MHA DO. No. 22011/05/2010-SR/CCTNS P-1** dated **21st December, 2015 (p/c-23)**. Subsequent to several meetings MHA issued another letter dated **21st April, 2016** requesting submission of proposal for implementation of CCTNS/ICJS project **(p/c-24)**. In response, NIC accepted the responsibility and submitted an initial proposal dated **25th April, 2016 (p/c-31)** which envisaged an expenditure of **Rs. 6.0 Crores** to carry out the following:

- a) Development of dashboard to integrate Prison, Court, Police, Prosecution, Forensic, Fingerprint and Juvenile Justice.
- b) Preparation of Comprehensive proposal.

NIC proposal was approved and released an amount of **Rs. 3.6 Crores** to NICSI towards the commencement of the project **(p/c-32)**.

However, in due course the requirement has been diversified and hence along with the Development of Dashboard, many other activities have been initiated and hence NIC has submitted additional proposal dated **29th March, 2017 (p/c-46)** which envisaged an expenditure of **Rs. 17.0 Crores**. The proposal was approved and an amount of **Rs. 5.2 Crores** was released to NICSI **(p/c-51)**. In total, the MHA approved **Rs. 23.0 Crores** and released **Rs. 11.20 Crores** to NICSI for execution of various activities under ICJS project **(p/c-58)**. The following are the major activities carried out by NIC under ICJS project:

- a) Development of Dashboard to integrate Prison, Court, Police, Prosecution, Forensic & Juvenile Justice **(as per letter at p/c-24)**.
- b) Digitalpolice.gov.in Portal developed and launched **(as per letter at p/c-57)**.
- c) National Search for Police (CCTNS) data across the country is achieved by using the aggregated data at NDC **(as per letter at p/c-57)**.


FLAG 'K' | h) Implementation of Prosecution S/W in 13 states are initiated as per the MHA approval dated **27th September, 2017 (as per letter at p/c-61)**.

To achieve the ultimate goal of **"One data once entry"** (may see at **para 4 of p/n-2**) the ICJS require to directly interact with State Data Centres (SDCs). As this is not included in the initial proposal of NIC, through enclosed letter at (**p/c-66**), we may request NIC to include the same in the scope of their activity and submit a proposal for implementation of complete ICJS project. This concept would help the MHA in many ways like:

- Web services can be developed among the various pillars.
- Get rid off the dependency on the Instances established in the NDC, which results in saving considerable expenditure.
- In future, the ICJS itself can replace the CAS Centre with minimum expenditure.
- To switch over to open source (as recommended by NITI Aayog at **p/c-64**) for CAS Centre. (CCTNS Centre application)

In regard to hardware, the NICSI is in the process of procuring the hardware for Karnataka and expect to deliver during 2nd to 4th week of January 2018.

4. Further, the State of Karnataka is also chosen for implementation of "one data once entry" feature in ICJS project, for which we need the intervention of ACS to coordinate among the authorities of Police, Prison, Court, Forensic, Prosecution and Fingerprint.

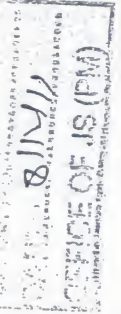


The State of Maharashtra, Goa, Haryana and Gujarat are using locally developed software for management of Prisons in their States while other States using Centralized e-Prison software developed by NIC. These States may need special attention to integrate Prison software with ICJS. **Maharashtra, Haryana & Gujarat** are also pilot sites for implementation of **e-Prosecution** software.

The undersigned is already in touch with NIC State Informatics officer of these States and they expected an instruction from MHA to State Governments to expedite the implementation. They agreed to coordinate with the State Government to fix the meetings once they received the communication from MHA.


Separate Draft letters are prepared for these 4 States requesting the State Governments for the following:

- a) **Instructing the investigating officers in the State to utilize the National Search feature of ICJS and provide input to enhance the system.**
- b) **Organizing a coordination meeting with all the Stake Holders in the State along with the officers of NIC, MHA and NCRB.**

In view of the above, the enclosed **Draft** letters at p/c-82 to p/c-85 may please be considered to issue to Chief Secretary (Home) Govt. of **Goa**, Additional Chief Secretary (Home) of **Gujarat, Maharashtra & Haryana** respectively.



The Additional Chief Secretary (ACS) to Government of Karnataka in his letter (at p/c-97) requested MHA to expedite the process of supplying H/W for implementation of Prosecution project and mentioned that "no update from the MHA/NIC" received since 09/10/2017.

2. In fact, the undersigned is in continuous contact with NIC Karnataka State Unit and NIC/NICSI team in Delhi. NIC State Unit assisted Prosecution Department for site preparation, already conducted training for two batches of Public Prosecutors (PPs) and today (19/02/2018) they will be conducting training for District PPs & Assistant PPs.

3. The MHA also communicated ACS on 18th December 2017 (at p/c-74) regarding the implementation plan in the State of Karnataka. However, in the said communication it was mentioned that the hardware would be commissioned during the 3rd or 4th week of January 2018, which could not happen as the NICSI was compelled to use GEM channel instead of their own rate contract.

4. Overall, the effort put by NIC Karnataka State Unit is satisfactory towards implementation of Prosecution project but ACS may not have been briefed properly. Presently, the NICSI has placed the order and the copy of the same is enclosed at p/c-103.

Sub: Draft letter to Chief Secretary (Home), Govt. of Goa.

MHA requested Chief Secretary (Home), Govt. of Goa (through letter at p/c-87 dated 15th January 2018) for his personal intervention to expedite the implementation of ICJS project, convene a meeting and advise the IOs in the State to utilize the National Search feature of ICJS in their day to day investigation. Hoy

2. In response, MHA received the letter attached at p/c-107, from Govt. of Goa, which indicates that they are attempting to integrate with different agencies locally instead of integrating at National level through ICJS. However, their letter is silent about the steps to be taken towards implementation of ICJS. "B"

3. The State of Goa is not using Wipro developed CAS S/W for Police and e-Prison developed by NIC. Presently, they are using TCS developed S/W for both Police & Prison, which are also not integrated. Their letter indicates that an expenditure of Rs. 3,12,785/= envisaged to integrate CCTNS with their own standalone Prison system. Further, their attempt to integrate with Vahan & Sarthi of RTO and Case Information System(CIS) of e-Committee could not yield any result.

4. However, even if the State of Goa achieve success in their approach of integrating at State level, it does not full-fill the objective of ICJS, as ICJS targets to integrate at National data of Police, Prison and Court. Further, the approach attempted by Goa is more complex than the approach suggested in ICJS. Under ICJS, the State of Goa, need to make only the arrangement to integrate CCTNS with ICJS and their Prison system with Central e-Prison system. G-COPS

5. Under ICJS presently the following modules can be implemented in any States:

- a) National search across all the pillars.
- b) Central Forensic software.
- c) Central Prosecution software.
- d) Road accident reporting portal.

6. As per the discussion with CCTNS-Nodal officer, the Government of Goa yet to notify the name of ICJS-Nodal officer, and hence the NIC-implementation team is facing challenges in the absence of Single Point of Contact for ICJS project. It seems, the Govt. of Goa has not taken any action on the MHA letter dated, 30th September, 2015 attached at p/c-108. This point may also be included in the proposed letter.

SUBJECT: Pursuing the State Government for implementation of ICJS project.

The MHA is implementing ICJS project through NIC. Initially, it was considered to commence the project in the State of Bihar, Delhi, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Telangana (see at p/n-2) and subsequently it was also decided to implement in the States on "first come first serve" basis (see at p/n-3) depending on their readiness as there are several local factors involved in the implementation. The following are some of the important communication made from MHA to States:

- On 30th September, 2015 (see at p/c-108) MHA requested the Home Secretaries of all States/UTs to nominate a nodal officer for ICJS to act as a single point of contact during the execution of the project. Flag "A"
- On 19th September, 2016, MHA wrote to all CCTNS Nodal officers to communicate their readiness to link CCTNS to ICJS (see at p/c-60.2). Flag "B"
- Subsequently, on different occasions, letters are also issued to State Home Secretaries of Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Rajasthan (details are at p/c-121). Flag "C"
- On 27th September, issued sanction for implementation of e-Forensic application across India (p/c-59) to all CCTNS-Nodal officers of States/UTs. Flag "D"
- On 27th September, issued sanction for implementation of e-Prosecution application across India (p/c-61) to 13 States through CCTNS-Nodal officers of States/UTs. Flag "E"

2. After pursuing the above communication by MHA & NIC State Units, the following are the major achievements:

- Received ICJS-Nodal officer nominations for 20 States (p/c-123) Flag "F"
- On consultation with various Forensic Laboratories in States, the e-Forensic s/w has been developed, tested and launched. Flag "G"
- Out of 112 Forensic laboratories in the country 42 labs started using e-Forensic software. (details are at p/c-124) Flag "H"
- On consultation with Prosecution office in Karnataka & Delhi, the e-Prosecution has been developed and hosted centrally. The system has been released for testing and training in all the approved 13 States. Flag "I"
- In 16 States, the CCTNS network has been configured to access Central ICJS system and the Police stations in these States can use national search on Police, Prison & Court database through ICJS.

- The portal for Road Accident Reporting has been developed and hosted. The portal has been tested by the State of MP and Rajasthan. The changes recommended by the States are incorporated and the portal is ready to roll out across the country.
3. It is proposed to pursue the States one by one depend on readiness of NIC local team and State Government. In this regard a communication (p/c-125) is received from the NIC State coordinator Kerala to issue a letter to State Home Secretary Kerala to convene a meeting of all concerned authorities.
 4. May be noted at p/c-126, all the 54 prisons in the State of Kerala have been on-boarded on Central e-Prison & an amount of Rs. 130 lakhs had been released in FY 2017-18 for prison computerization. Further, as per the list at p/c-123, the State of Kerala is yet to nominate ICJS-Nodal officer.
 5. On the basis of the above facts and communication from NIC State coordinator Kerala (p/c-125), the enclosed draft letter at p/c-127 may please be consider to issue to Additional Chief Secretary (Home) of Government of Kerala.

Subject: Draft reply to the letter of ACS Kerala.

The Additional Chief Secretary (Home) to Govt. of Kerala in his letter (at p/c- 145) requested MHA for the following: Flag 'A'

- Arrangements to share information on cases related to Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) between Police and Excise Departments.
 - Departments like Excise, Forest, Vigilance, Customs etc. also be brought under ICJS.
 - The CAS of CCTNS need to be modified for use in other departments like Excise, Forest, Vigilance, etc.
 - ICJS/CCTNS should be able to consume data from other departments if they are using any other software for registration and investigation otherwise ICJS should provide entry screen for filling IIF forms for other departments.
 - The National Search should be made available to all other departments and search facility may be restricted to be criminals who have been apprehended for the laws being enforced by the specific department.
2. May be noted that the request is mainly for integration of various databases owned by the States with ICJS and may also require to provide Centralized software to input data in case the departments does not have any system in place.
3. The MHA has already constituted a Committee (as per enclosure at p/c-142) under the Chairmanship of Director (NCRB) to initiate actions for integration of CCTNS with other National and State databases through ICJS. The Committee met on 3rd December, 2018 and discussed about possible databases proposed to be integrated with CCTNS/ICJS. During the discussion the Committee identified 29 national and State level databases which require to be integrated with CCTNS/ICJS to enable effective and seamless information interchange between various organizations so that the investigating officers can get timely assistance across the organizations. The copy of the said MoM is enclosed at p/c-145.4. Flag
4. May be noted that the most of the departments identified by ACS (Kerala) to be brought under ICJS Platform are not part of the wish list prepared by integration Committee. Hence, we may add the departments Flag

like Forest, Vigilance and Customs in the wish list prepared by the committee.

5. As most of the databases referred by ACS (Kerala) are State level databases and hence, integration required to be made at State level instead of Central level. However, once we succeed integration in one State/UT the same can be used in other States/UTs may be with minor changes.

6. Presently, the development team is facing challenges in the absence of proactive user department to drive the project. The MHA has already received three letters (enclosed at p/c-145, p/c-146 and p/c-147) from the State of Kerala for integration of their various systems with ICJS/CCTNS and hence we may consider the State of Kerala for Pilot State for integrating with Forest, Customs, Excise, Vigilance etc.

7. The note sheet along with draft letter is also shared with NCRB. The NCRB has agreed the approach and their concurrence is at p/c-147.1.

In view of the above it is proposed to issue a letter to ACS(Home) Govt. of Kerala to convene a meeting of representatives from all concerned authorities including Police, Prison, Prosecution, Forensic, Court, Excise, Forest, Customs, Vigilance etc. where the implementation strategy can be discussed and formulated. A draft reply is enclosed at p/c-148 for consideration to issue to ACS(Home) of govt. of Kerala. This may be issued at appropriate level either by MHA or by NCRB.
